ABOUT DPL

DPL was established with assistance from UNESCO as a pilot project and inaugurated by Prime Minister, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, on 27th October, 1951. DPL provides free library and information services to residents of Delhi. Currently the busiest public library in south-east Asia, it has several branches and sub-branches, as also community and resettlement colony libraries all over Delhi. Additionally, it runs a braille library for the visually impaired, a prison library for the inmates of Tihar Jail, and provides mobile library services to areas without library facilities.

With an ever expanding membership, the DPL network has a collection of over 18 lakh books in English, Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu. All main branch libraries have a separate children's section with an exclusive children's library in Jor Bagh. Apart from constantly replenishing its book stock, DPL provides some special services to its members. These include:

Free internet service: High-speed, internet service has been provided to members at the Central Library (S.P. Mukherjee Marg), Sarojini Nagar and Patel Nagar branches, Janak Puri and Vinoba Puri subbranches. (This is being expanded to cover 5 more libraries within the year). The service is free.

Free CD/DVD issue: DPL has launched the free lending of their CD/DVD collection at the Central Library and at the Sarojini Nagar and Patel Nagar branches. The DVD collection comprises English and Hindi movies, as also educational, recreational and pictures meant for children.


Revamped children's sections: DPL has revamped its children's sections at the Central Library and at the Sarojini Nagar and Patel Nagar branches. New books, CDs/DVDs, attractive furniture and games have been added to the existing collections.

DPL online catalogue: DPL has issued an online catalogue, using the Koha open source library automation software. Members and users from across the world can now access the most recent catalogue of the DPL system through the websites www.dpl.gov.in/ or www.delhipubliclibrary.in/

The content and design of the exhibits in the Newseum are products of an original voluntary research project using primary source material from the DPL newspaper archives, led by Gauri Varma on behalf of 9.9 Media Pvt. Selected policy decisions/events that encapsulate crucial moments in Indian history from 1951 to now are featured along with actual government files obtained from the National Archives, displaying how important government decisions were taken.
