ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Ornamentation	
Exteriors	: The exterior of the <i>vimana</i> is plain except rampart lion on each <i>raha, dopichhasimha</i> and <i>beki</i> -Bhairava over the <i>beki</i> . The frontal <i>raha</i> is represented with a miniature <i>angashikhara</i> crowned by a <i>gaja-kranta</i> motif. The <i>talajangha</i> & <i>uparajangha</i> are represented with <i>nayikas</i> in different postures.
Interiors	 Pilasters crowned by <i>dopichhasimhas</i> are noticed on each corner of the <i>jagamohana</i> in the inner side.
Movable Collections	: An image of Narasimha.
* Any Other (specify)	: The vimana is pancharatha on plan and panchangabada in elevation and the pista has three mouldings.
