Exteriors : Devoid of decoration, except the *naga-nagi* pilaster in

ascending order over the dual *gajakranta* motif, latticed window on the eastern and western side whereas the northern side has an entrance and the back wall has a

niche flanked by plain pilasters.

Interiors : Plain

Movable Collections : Votive stupas, *thabas*, fragmented sculptures, temple

fragments, pillar members etc.

* Any Other (specify) : Just close to the temple a rock-cut niche (0.40 mtrs x

0.29 mtrs in length and breadth) housing a Dhyani Buddha flanked by a pair of flying Vidyadhara on the top and a rock-cut water storage measuring 1.40 mtrs x 1.26 mtrs x 1.25 mtrs in length, width and depth respectively.
