enshrining dikpalas in the kanika pagas; and different form of siva like – Andhakasurabadha murty, Ekapada Bhairava, Nataraja etc. and Parvati in the anuratha pagas. Miniatrure rekah mundi in all pagas on the base of the gandi, tala-garbhika in the pabhaga; udyota simha in all direction at the raha and dopichasimha and

deulacharini over the beki.

Miniature Rekahmundi enshrining female devotee

worshipping Lingam.
