ARCHITECTURAL STYLE

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ornamentation 			
Exteriors	:	<p>The temple is decorated with architectural motifs such as <i>khakharamundi</i> in the <i>talajangha</i> and <i>pidhamundi</i> in the upper <i>jangha</i>. The <i>mundis</i> in the <i>vimana</i> are carved with <i>Dikpalas</i> and their counterparts in the <i>talajangha</i> and upper <i>jangha</i> respectively in the <i>kanika</i> projection. The conjunctions are housed with <i>vidalas</i> in the <i>talajangha</i> and <i>nayikas</i>, mother with child, divinities, etc are in the upper <i>jangha</i>. The <i>raha</i> niches are housed with <i>parsvadevatas</i> like Ganesa, Kartikeya and Parvati. The niche is based over a <i>talagarbhika</i> of <i>rekha</i> design. The <i>varanda</i> portion of the <i>raha</i> niches are crowned with three miniature <i>rekhamundi angasikhara</i>. The frontal <i>raha</i> projected with a <i>rekha angasikhara</i> which is surmounted by a <i>gaja-kranta</i>. The <i>beki</i> of the temple is adorned with <i>dopichhasimha</i> over the <i>kanika</i> projections and <i>deulacharini</i> over the <i>raha</i> projections. The <i>jagamohana</i> is provided with two decorated <i>gabakshya</i> (window) in the northern and southern direction and each balustrade is designed with <i>nayika</i> sculpture.</p>	
Interiors	:	<p>The interior of the cell is plain, the doorjambs of the <i>vimana</i> is carved with three <i>sakhas</i> (<i>lata</i>, <i>kutla</i> & <i>Gelaba</i>) from interior to exterior. The <i>Graha</i> panel in the lintel is broken. Saivite <i>dvarapalas</i> are housed in the niches at the bottom of the doorjambs.</p>
