ARCHITECTURAL STYLE

Ornamentation

Exteriors : The temple is decorated with architectural motifs such

as khakharamundi in the talajangha and pidhamundi in the upper jangha. The mundis in the vimana are carved with Dikpalas and their counterparts in the talajangha and upper jangha respectively in the kanika projection. The conjunctions are housed with vidalas in the talajangha and nayikas, mother with child, divinities, etc are in the upper jangha. The raha niches are housed with parsvadevatas like Ganesa, Kartikeva and Parvati. The niche is based over a talagarbhika of rekha design. The varanda portion of the raha niches are crowned with three miniature rekhamundi angasikhara. The frontal raha projected with a rekha angasikhara which is surmounted by a gaja-kranta. The beki of the temple is adorned with dopichhasimha over the kanika projections and deulacharini over the raha projections. The jagamohana is provided with two decorated gabakshya (window) in the northern and southern direction and each balustrade is designed

with nayika sculpture.

Interiors : The interior of the cell is plain, the doorjambs of the

vimana is carved with three sakhas (lata, kutila & Gelaba) from interior to exterior. The Graha panel in the lintel is broken. Saivite dvarapalas are housed in

the niches at the bottom of the doorjambs.
