It is painted in Red ochre from exterior. It has 'Mukhmandapa' surmounted by ribbed circular dome followed by 'Mandpam' and finally the 'grabh-griha(sanctum sanctorum)'. The first two structures adorned with beautiful

design on its circular dome having inverted lotus type of pinnacle. The main spire made in typical Nagara style which flanked by an inverted lotus and Bijpurak. In the sanctum–sanctorum there is a stone image of Lord Ram ,Sita , and Lakhmana placed on a raised platform within a domical Chhatri.
