pillared hall. The main shrine is built in typical nagara style having multiple turrets. The entire temple is made of stone and has elaborate carvings. At the top of the temple there is a huge 'Amalaka' is surmounted by a water vessels followed by bijpurak and it is painted in gold. In the interior the super structure is upholding by huge and lofty multiangular stone pillars. In front of the sanctum, stone image of 'Garur-vahana' of main deity has been placed on a raised platform in the Garbh-griha. The image of Radha and Krishna has been installed on a raised platform.
