The Bhutan Week will showcase and share Bhutan's rich culture and the Bhutanese way of life with the people of India.

#### Theme 1: Zorig Chusum: Bhutan's living arts and crafts

The arts and crafts represent the exclusive 'spirit and identity of Bhutan'. Buddhist arts have existed pre-Zhabdrung period (1594-1651), and it was formally codified during the reign of the fourth secular ruler Desi Tenzin Rabgay (1680-1694) and came to be known as Zorig Chusum meaning thirteen


Bhutan's finest artists and craftsmen will share the special techniques used to create them with visitors, who will have a rare opportunity to see these art forms together in one place. The artisans will share their artistic skills and insights.

A country's identity is defined by its culture and tradition. Among the most visible aspects of these features is the tradition of Performing Arts.

The exhibition will showcase the types of Performing Arts of Bhutan in the form of mask dances and folk songs and dances. The idea of incorporating music, song, folk and mask dances is to provide opportunity for the visitors to experience all aspects of traditional and contemporary Bhutanese music and dance.



#### Theme 3: Religious Arts

The Bhutanese religious art is the artistic practices that are influenced by Vairavana Buddhism and its pantheons of teachers and divine beings. There are varieties of ritual arts and practices of which the Zhung Dratshang (the Central Monastic Body) will display five exhibits comprising of ritual performance, sand mandala, toma (bali) making, astrology and dhoe (cross-thread) making



Visitors will have an opportunity to see live ritual performances by the Central Monastic Body monks unique to Bhutan.

#### Theme 4: Bhutanese Textiles and **Emerging Fashion**

Textiles are considered the highest form of art and spiritual expression in Bhutan. As a symbol of our national identity; it transcends social, cultural, religious and traditional parameters and continues to remain significant in present day Bhutanese society.

This exhibition is aimed at promoting and creating awareness of the intricate Bhutanese textiles and emerging Bhutanese fashion to the visitors and also providing a better understanding and greater appreciation for the Bhutanese textile traditions. There will be exhibition of artefacts and contemporary designs, live demonstrations and fashion show.



#### Theme 5: Bhutan Food Fair

Bhutanese cuisines have multi dishes which makes a Bhutanese culture unique. The main dish which generally includes white or red rice, seasonal vegetables, and meat are often cooked with chilli or cheese. Bhutan's popularly dish is 'Ema-datse" hot chilli cooked with the cheese.

#### Theme 6: Trade Fair on Products of Bhutan

The Trade Fair on Products of Bhutan offers a cluster of Bhutan's authentic arts and crafts, textile. industrial products and other organic and homegrown agricultural produce. The exhibition aims to promote goods and services, attract business partners, foreign investments and transfer of knowhow and technologies.

There will also be Business to Business (B2B) and Business to Consumer (B2C) contacts and linkages for promotion of India as a market for Bhutanese products.



#### Theme 7: Tourism Fair



#### Theme 9: Display of models of Dzongs, Lhakhangs (Temples) and Tashi Gomang


Some of the prominent dzong and temple models will be displayed during Exhibition to showcase Bhutan's rich architectural heritage. It will give visitors an

#### Theme 11: Display of Bhutan's Highland Culture, Tradition and lifestyle

Highlanders in Bhutan have unique culture and traditions that add value and colour to the country since they are the ones who inhabit the extreme frontier of the country.

Exhibition will be presenting "the pride of nation-Highlanders" where the visitors will be provided with the experience of highland, nomadic way of life, an exhibition of traditional highland dress, arts and crafts, Bja (Yak hair tents) and yak-related products.

A photographic exhibition consisting of black and white and in colour photos depicting leaders of Bhutan and India since 1958 during their state visits to each other's countries will be showcased. The objectives of this photographic exhibition is to re-visit the past close ties between the two nations;

to educate the youth and the general audience on the numerous visits to each other's countries by the leaders of the two nations; to further strengthen the existing close ties between the two nations.







### Theme 15: Postage stamps: The first global face of Bhutan

Bhutan introduced postage stamps in 1940. Many of them were the world's firsts, like the first scented stamps, the first steel foil stamps, the first talking stamps, the first three-dimensional (3-D) stamps, and the first silk stamps.
