### **About the Seminar:**

This seminar, by connecting Indian aesthetics, psychology and cognitive sciences will explore new frontiers of interdisciplinary investigation into the Natyasastra. It will attempt to prominently place the classical value, imagination and experience of Natyasastra by focusing on the text, theory and experience of rasa with the goal of building and bridging contemporaneity in psychology, cognitive sciences, and Indian aesthetic traditions.

### Abstract:

The rasa theory formulated in the Natyashastra has received a staggering amount of attention as the main hypothesis pervading studies into Indian aesthetics. New advances in consciousness and cognitive studies, offer new perspectives and methodologies to examine the science of Natyasastra. Though there have been significant works with a classical approach to the text and the concept of rasa, in order to understand the far-reaching implications of aesthetic moods, experiences, causes, and more importantly narratives in the rising importance of human cognition, consciousness and self-identity; the experience of rasa must be viewed in an interdisciplinary context.

### **About IGNCARCB:**
