# Shri K.K. Bhatia a Social worker with a will of steel

In 1994, a man waited for six hours to meet a Tihar prisoner convicted for drug peddling, just so that he could arrange for a free artificial limb he had promised the man. Others may have given up when told by jail authorities that with the disabled jailer's cell an hour and a half away it would be impossible to arrange a meeting. But not this man. He preserved until he could meet the convict, and later after months of negotiations with jail authorities, managed to have the NGO providing the limb to visit the convict and have him fitted for it. This man with a will of steel was K.K. Bhatia. And he went on to arrange for eight more artificial limbs for prisoners.

Born in 1929, K.K. Bhatia, an ex-armed forces man, was by profession a librarian. In other avatars he was a freedom fighter and social worker. Till his death in November 2023, Bhatia worked relentlessly for the cause of prisoners. He operated, supported by just his pension, from his humble single story house in Rajouri Garden, a house surrounded by palatial bungalows. He also worked with Tihar authorities to promote reading as a habit among prisoners and stressed on the need for prison libraries. The branch of the Delhi Public Library (DPL) in Tihar jail, was in fact opened as a result of his persistent efforts. As a library professional Bhatia after retirement travelled to remote areas in the states of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand to raise awareness on the benefits of rural libraries. This man of high integrity and a strong belief in social causes pledged his body to medical science before his death.
