No matter how fast paced and technologically advanced our lives have become since Mahatma Gandhi's times, the essence of Gandhiji's teachings are as relevant today as they were then, because the basic human nature itself has not changed.

Despite being the face of Indian freedom movement, Gandhij is a figure revered by the whole world. He is so respected that his birth anniversary, 2" October, is criebrated every year as the International Day of Non-Violence by the United Nations. Lovingly addressed as "Bapu" by all Indians, his teachings are timeless and relevant even in today's time. For Indians he is the "Father of Our Nation". Not only in India even globally his way of life and life lessons are something that everyone can benefit from. This year's Day puts the focus on sustainability and the environment.

Gandhi honored humanitarian obligation to all living things. He reminded us that "Earth provides enough to satisfy everyone's needs, but not everyone's greed. We know that a culture of non-violence begins with respect for others, but it does not end there. To nurture peace, we must respect nature.

Mahatma Gandhi not only led the freedom movement in India, but worked throughout his life for social change and the development of society. At the heart of Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy of nonviolence, was hes belief that strength comes from righteousness, not force; power comes from truth, not might; and that victory comes from moral courage not imposed submission. He said in all the activities, the youth must be involved as an agent of social-political change in society. Be the change you want to see in the world

Everyone wants to live in a better world. We all hope and pray that the world would change and become a better place for our children, but not many of us want to be an instrument to that change.

Gandhiji always said there can be no change in the world if we are not ready to change ourselves. He firmly believed that the change starts at home and for a world less corrupt, more affable for the future generations; we need to embrace total integrity in ourselves. No change is too small and by and by we can change the world, taking one small step at a time.

Going further on his teachings he also propagated Cleanliness is Next to Godiness, Gandhiji was an ardent believer in this philosophy. He vigorously supported cleanliness of both the body and soul. He believed that having a clean body is as important as having a clean mind. Bapu said "When there is both inner and outer cleanliness, it approaches godiness."

Keeping not only our own

houses clean but also working towards keeping our streets and cities clean is the path to attaining godliness.

Education which does not mould character is absolutely worthless

education he also said that teaching children only for the sake of literacy is worthless if it does not focus on an all-round education. He emphasized on the development of children in body, mind and spirit and not just education as a bool to earn money. He believed well rounded people can contribute to the development of a better society and stronger nation.

Children who are educated only for the sake of literacy and earning a living cannot contribute much in a nation's development. Gendhiji believed in the power of character not appearances. He believed in accepting our flaws and turning them into strengths. He believed in the power of forgiveness and acceptance.

The teachings of Mahatma Gandhi will always be enlightening for our children and all the generations to come. Children across all religions, borders, cultures should be able to benefit from this wealth of knowledge.
