The Power of Words: Understanding Indian Culture through its Key Concepts - Kalātattvakośa

25 years ago two great programmes have been conceived as the conceptual core of IGNCA: One is concerned with the key concepts of Indian culture, in the form of a Lexicon of Sanskrit terms, Kalātattvakośa; the other with fundamental texts of art theory in different art-forms: Kalāmūlaśāstra.

But the cultural and intellectual landscape of India has changed drastically in these 25 years. The lecture will address these changes and the enduring importance and relevance of the Lexicon, even more important in the face of a loss of knowledge and cultural identity on the one hand, and in the context of a growing interest in interdisciplinary connections, which have been inherent in the Indian world-view, and which are underlying the different art-forms, whether consciously or unconsciously.

Deciphering the Indian Arts: The Project of Fundamental Texts-Kalāmūlaśāstra

The second conceptual core project of IGNCA concerns the rich and fascinating literature on different art-forms. These primary texts had hardly been explored earlier, but they are essential for understanding not only Indian aesthetics, but the technicalities of each of these art-forms.

The division between śāstra and prayoga, or theory and practice, has been there in the past as well as in the present, when scholars have no practical experience in any art-form, and performers are mostly ignorant of the theories underlying their art. The publication of this series has gone a long way in bridging this gap.

The lecture will throw light on the importance of the series and its contribution to preserving the cultural and artistic heritage.

Dr. Bettina Sharada Bäumer, Indologist from Austria living and working in Varanasi since 1967, has been Honorary Coordinator of IGNCA for eight years, Visiting Professor in several Universities (accredited to the University of Vienna, Austria). She has been Fellow and Visiting Professor at the Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Shimla. She is author and editor of about 25 books and 60 research articles in the fields of Agama and Kashmir Śaivism, Temple Architecture, Śilpaśāstra and religious traditions of Orissa, Indian Aesthetics and spirituality.

On 7 December 2012 she was conferred the Austrian Cross of Honour for Science and Art 1st Class at the Austrian Embassy in New Delhi.
