The first Session mainly devoted to open discussions, challenges, goals, and future of higher market. The following topics were discussed:-

Library Automation/User journey: SaaS, usability testing, discovery,
 open integrations

- Evidence BasedDecision Making: data, analytics, library impact student outcomes, collection development based
- Collection Development: needs, pain points, new programs, working through budget constraints, source types
- Community: FOLIO, DRM-free, Open Dissertations
- Future Vision of Library: resources, staffing, workflows
- Books: print, electronic, requirements, local content, publisher
  eCollections

During the above two Sessions, the issues and challenges, goals and the future of the Library Market and also future vision of Library, like resources, staffing, workflows and also working through budgetary constraints, etc., were raised at length. Mr. Mike MacKinnon, Director of Software as Service Innovation, EBSCO Information Services spoke at length on the topics Repositories, Preservation and Education Workflows & also Software as a Service Update.

The discussions in the meeting were very fruitful and also useful in context of the growth of Libraries across the world. The meeting was beneficial to me both as a Library professional and also in discharge of my day-to-day functioning in the IGNCA.

During the Concluding Session, Open Discussions on various issues concerning emerging Library and Technologies were discussed.
