Campana was one of the most skillful and at the same time most unscrupulous collectors that the world has ever seen. Running short of funds he pledged his collection for 4,000,000 francs, exhausted the money in further purchases, was charged with fraud and condemned to the galley. The sentence was remitted by Pope Pio. Nine on condition of his giving up his collections. The Pope's Government offered to sell them to the French Government, but the offer was declined. The Russian Government then purchased a portion for 500,000 francs, and it is now in the Hermitage Museum. The English Government purchased the objects of the Renaissance and Middle Ages. Louis Napoleon at last came forward and purchased the remainder for 4,000,000 francs. It was transferred to the Louvre and was known as "Musée Napoléon III.," and after the fall of the empire it was incorporated with the other collections and part of it placed in Trocadéro Museum.

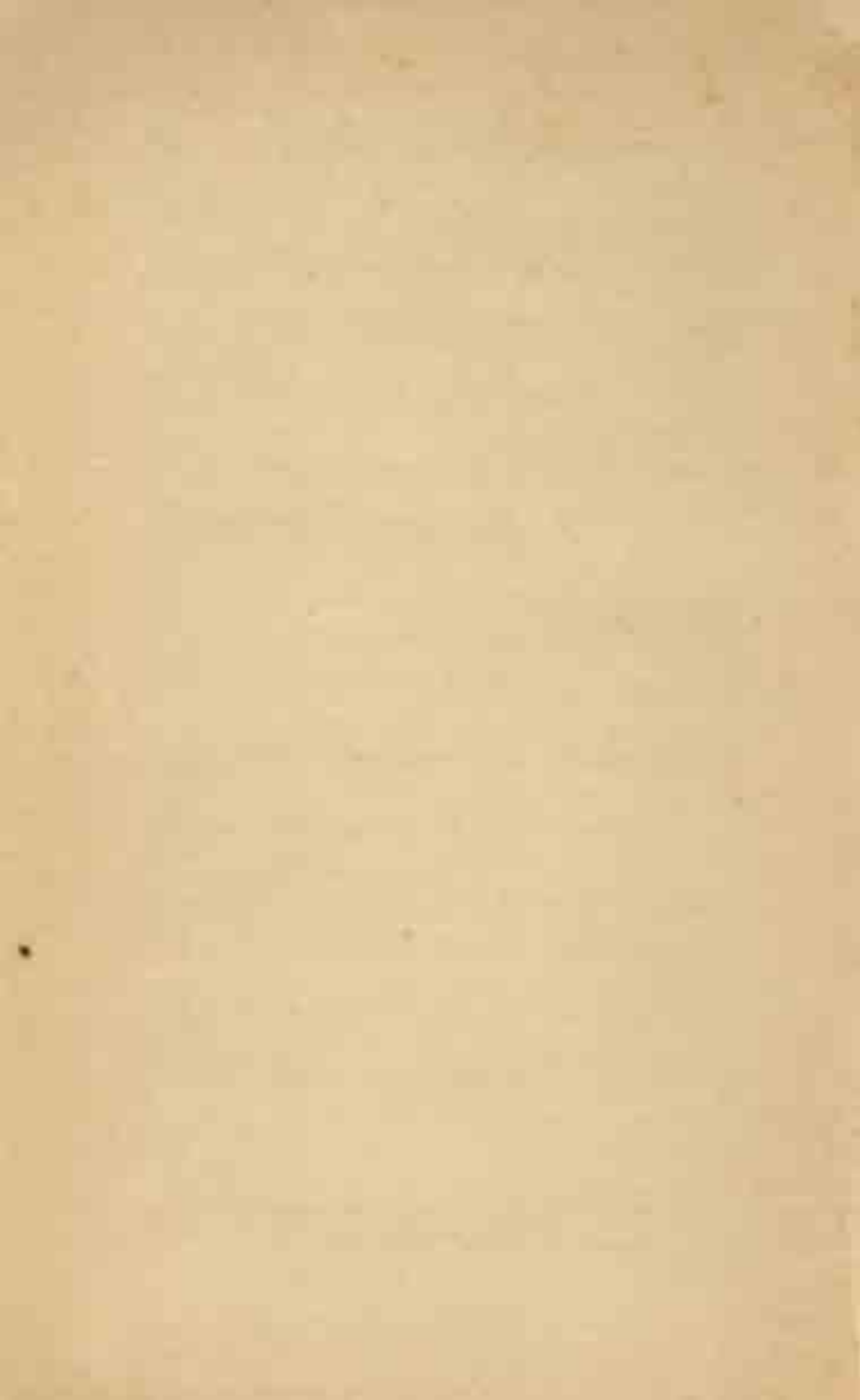
