





3. There was a decrease of 11,761 in the number of visitors to the Museum

during the year as compared with that of the preceding year.

4. The number of specimens added to the Museum during the year was 21 of which 15 were received by way of donation.

SIR.

I have the honor to submit my report on the working of the Government Museum during the year 1925-26.

- 1. Pers nnel.—Mr. G. H. Krumbiegel was in charge of the Museum till the 23rd July 1925, on which date I assumed charge of it in pursuance of Government Notification No. 219,—C. B. 18-25-1 dated 20th July 1925.
- 2. Visitors.—The total number of visitors to the Museum during the year was 3,6,3,29. Of this number 1,89,357 were males, 1,60,932 females, and 650 school children.

Twelve thousand and forty (12,040) or about $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent wrote their names in in the Visitors' Book.

The largest crowds were, as usual, during "Karaga" and on some of the local festivals e.g., Pongal, Sivaratri, Holy Feast, Ramzan, Bakrid, Gouri, Ganesa, Dasara, Deepavali, etc.

3. Building.—During the year, the Public Works Depattment carried out the work of whitewashing the interior and colorwashing the exterior. The doors and windows were also painted.

The department has fixed a Flagstaff on the roof of the building and hoisted the Mysore Flag on the occasion of the Birthday of His Highness the Maharaja of Mysore.

The need for a Watershed and Public Latrine near the Museum for the convenience of the numerous visitors, was urged for the consideration of Government. The former proposal was deferred for the present while the latter is being considered.

4. Furniture. - Some show cases and the furniture in the office and library and a number of picture frames were renovated. New frames were made for four historical pictures.

The Pitsafe in which the Coins and other valuables are secured, was repaired and painted with a damp-proof paint.

- 5. Collections.—The collections remained on the whole in good condition and 21 exhibits were added as follows:—
- (a) Fossils.—One fossilised pre-historic Sea Urchin was presented by Mr. E. W. Fritchley.
- (b) Geology and Minerology.—The marginally noted specimens were received from the Mysore Geological Department. A stone found in the Tamhini river was presented by Mr. J. Reubens.

- (c) Economic products.—The old and damaged specimens of country and bazaar articles were renewed.
- (d) Art Section.—One ornamental miniature fretwork tower with a time-piece fixed in it was presented by Mr. B. V. Krishniengar.
- (e) Sculptures and Antiquities.—One Stone Axe-head found in Karwi, Banda District, U. P. was presented by Mr. J. R. Corbet.
- (f) Coins and Numismatol gy.—The collection was secured in a trunk and was temporarily lodged in the State Huzur Treasury for safety, on account of the repairs, etc., of the pitsafe and the building.
 - (g) Reptalia.—five snake specimens were added.
- (h) Insects.—One blue and green Nilgiri butterfly was presented by Mr. E. W. Fritchley of Coonoor.
 - (i) Arachinida.—One large black scorpion was purchased.
 - (j) Shells and Corals.—The marginally noted specimens were presented by 3 Pectens—brown, yellow and orange callop shell, 1 small top shell, and slipper Limpets of different colors.

The work of going through the cases and cleaning was carried out. The Specimens in the Zoological Section are old, and even with the use of preservatives, they need renewal. The wornout specimens were however removed from public gaze.

With a view to augment the present stock of exhibits some of the departments of Government whose subjects are illustrated in the Museum, were addressed for samples.

A beginning was made to introduce explanatory bilingual (English and Kannada) labels.

6. Library.—The Catalogue was tevised and 19 books were added besides the departmental and other Museum Reports.

All copies of the Government of India specifications, gazette copies of which were received in the Museum from time to time, were transferred to the Controller of Patents in Mysore.

One hundred and ninety-nine persons consulted the library.

The shelves were re-arranged to admit of the opening of the side doors which were hitherto closed by placing almirahs against them.

- 7. Staff.—The work of the staff was satisfactory.
- 8. Maintenanc. The Government grant for the upkeep of the Institution for the year was Rs. 3,900 and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 3,820.

- 2. There was a fall in the number of visitors to the Museum, from 3,62,329 last year to 3,05,991 this year.
- 3. Seventy-three new exhibits were added to the collections during the year. Fourteen books, mostly on Zoology, were added to the Library. The most interesting addition was a valuable book of 12 views of places in Mysore by Lt. Colebrook, kindly presented by Mr. A. W. Hawkins of the Bengal-Nagpur Railway.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the report on the working of the Museum during the year 1926-27.

2. Personnel.-I continued to hold the charge of the Museum throughout the

year under report.

3. Visitors.—During the year the Museum was visited by 3,05,991 persons of whom 1,67,045 were males and 1,38,036 females and 910 school children. Twelve thousand four hundred and seventy-five (12,475) or about five per cent wrote their names in the visitors' book. The largest crowd were, as usual, during "Karaga" and some of the local festivals, e.g., Pongal, Sivaratri, Holy Feast, Ramzan, Bakrid, Gowri, Ganesha, Dasara, Deepavali, etc. The counting of the number of visitors is being systematised.

4. Building.—One of the doors in the Library which was damaged was got repaired by the Department of Public Works during the year.

- 5. Furniture.—The repair and renovation of show cases and furniture were attended to.
- 6. Collections.—The collections remained on the whole in good condition and seventy-three exhibits were added during the year.
- (a) Geology and Mineralogy.—The Kolar Gold Fields Mining Board kindly Wired screen to shift crushed ore Slimes, Tailings, Presented the Museum with the Coarse-sand, Sodium Cyanide, Zink shavings.
- (b) Industries.—Samples of towels, napkins, bed-sheets, carpets, coir-rugs and a Charka manufactured in the Central Jail were received from the Superintendent.
- (c) Economic Products.—The Director of Sandalwood Oil Factory supplied the Museum with samples of Sandalwood Oil, powder and billet and they were exhibited by the side of the specimen of the tree. Some samples of local cotton were added to the existing stock. Some old specimens of country and bazaar articles were renewed.
- (d) Coins and Medals.—Three Coins, 4 Medals and 3 Currency Notes of Goa were added to the existing stock.

In response to my request the Secretary, Kolar Gold Fields Mining Board, the Director of Sandalwood Oil Factory and the Superintendent, Central Jail, kindly supplied the Museum with samples of exhibits.

The work of going through the cases and cleaning, etc., was as usual, carried out. Many specimens specially in the Zoological section continue to be old and as many as 20 Birds had to be removed from the public gaze.

A large number of bilingual labels were got printed in the Government Press and were introduced in cases and on exhibits in place of the old manuscript labels which were indistinct and untidy.

7. Library.-Fourteen Books mostly on Zoology were added besides the Departmental and other Museum reports usually received. A valuable book of twelve views of places in Mysore State by Lieutenant Colebrook was presented by Mr. A. W. Hawkins of the Bengal-Nagpur Railway. Two hundred and thirty-six persons consulted the Library during the year.

8. Maintenance.-The Government grant for the upkeep of the Institution for

the year was Rs. 3,900 and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 3,871-6-0.







- 2. Personnel.—Mr. H. C. Javaraya was in charge of the Museum till the end of January 1928 when the charge was passed on to me.
- Visitors.—The total number of visitors to the Museum during the year was 297,152 of which 160,295 were males, 136,171 females and 686 school children.

Twelve thousand eight hundred and sixty-four or about five per cent wrote their names in the Visitors' Book. Large crowds were as usual during 'Karaga' and on some local feasts.

Details are furnished in Appendix "C".

- Building.—The building was maintained in good condition during the year.
- Collections.—The collections were kept in good condition and 56 exhibits were added during the year. The cases were as usual gone through and cleaning, etc. were attended to.

6. Library.—Eight books were added besides the usual departmental and other reports received.

There were 161 visitors to the Library.

7. Maintenance.—The Government grant for maintenance of this Institution was Rs. 3,800 for the year and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 3,642-5-0.

SIR.

I have the honor to submit the report on the working of the Mysore Government Museum for the year 1929-30 and to request that 50 copies may be kindly arranged

to be supplied for distribution.

2. Building .- During the year, the building was white-washed in the interior and the doors and windows were painted. The glasses of the ventilators were renewed with white glasses to give more light. There is still need for greater light specially on cloudy days, and estimate has been called for, for the introduction of electric lights.

3. Fittings and Furniture. - In order to remove congestion in some of the cases, four additional show cases were got done. Eight additional frames for the Revolving Portrait Stands were also made. Sixty show cases and office furniture were overhauled, polished and painted. The locks of thirty cases which had been

worn out were fitted up with new bolts and locks.

4. Visitors.—During the year, the Museum was visited by 2,40,566 persons against 2,63,409 of the previous year. As usual, there were crowds on 'Karaga' and on some of the local festivals. During 'Karaga', however, the crowd was less this year than that of last year and this partly, if not wholly, attributes to the difference in the total number of visitors. Of the number, 1,31,900 were males, 1,07,922 females and 744 school children.

Ten thousand nine hundred and nineteen or about 5 per cent wrote their names

in the Visitors' Book.

5. Archaelogy and Epigraphy.—A marble statue of Buddha was purchased.

There may probably some good statuary specimens lying in dilapidated temples or other places neglected and exposed. The District Officers have better opportunities to collect or report their existence, barring of course those which may have a local provenance or required for the restoration of any temple in the locality. The Director of Archæology and the District Officers may besides come across in their tours 'Virkals' and other ancient manuscripts, copperplates, coins, old weapons, old jewels, etc. The help and co-operation of these Officers are necessary to improve the Archæological collection in the Museum.

6. Coins and Medals.—Twenty-two War medals and eighty regimental badges

were purchased during the year.

- 7. Agriculture.—The Director of Agriculture has been requested to arrange for a representative collection of Agricultural products and other exhibits illustrating the activities of the Department. The collection of grains and pulses were renewed and relabelled.
- 8. Economic Products.—The manuscript labels were replaced with printed bilingual ones. 'The Planters' Association has been approached for a collection of samples of plantation and garden products.

- 9. Geology.—The Geological collection was rearranged and relabelled by the Geological Department. The printing of the new labels is being arranged. As there are a large number of foreign examples, it is proposed to use labels differing in color or bearing significant marks to differentiate the Mysore and outside specimens.
- 10. Health Exhibits.—The Sanitary Commissioner with Government of Mysore has been requested to arrange for a collection of health exhibits to educate the visitors in the matters of health, sanitation, etc. A model village which was lent by the District Economic Superintendent of Bangalore has been kept on show.
- 11. Zoology.—Forty decayed specimens, specially birds, were removed and endeavours are being made to augment the collection. Through the help and co-operation of the Forest Department and the Mysore Zoological gardens, it is hoped the collection would be improved early.
 - (1) Mammals.-Eight specimens were added to the collection.
 - (2) Birds.-Fourteen birds were added to the collection.
- (3) Snakes.—Four models of poisonous snakes and a snake-bite model were purchased. A python measuring 9½ feet was caught alive near the rock to the south of the Museum. It has been mounted and exhibited.
- 12. Industries.—The Director of Industries and Commerce has been requested to keep a collection of specimens of Mysore Arts and Industries on show in the Museum. Ten sets of Ivory and clay figures of Hindu mythology and nine figures of Christian gods were purchased.

Exhibits illustrating the activities of the Mysore Iron Works were obtained and kept on show. The C. P. Methonol supplied to the Museum by the works has been found to be satisfactory for preserving spirit specimens.

- Irrigation.—Four irrigation models of the tunnel works of the Irwin canal
 and an album of tunnel views and charts were got prepared for exhibition in the
 Museum.
- 14. Library.—Fourteen books were added during the year besides the reports, journals, etc., received from Departments and Institutions. There were one hundred and fifty readers in the Library during the year.
- 15. Maintenance.—Government were pleased to sanction a sum of Rs. 5,000 for purchase of specimens and called for a programme. Proposals for the improvements of the Museum have since been submitted to Government. In the meanwhile, requisitions were sent to the various heads of Departments whose subjects are represented in the Museum for collection and to the Deputy Commissioners of Districts to collect objects under certain heads which they or their subordinate officers may incidentally meet with in their tours and otherwise, as this arrangement may facilitate collection at a relatively low cost. Objects required for the Museum are not readily available and their acquisition takes time. The grant could not therefore be fully utilised before the close of the year. Out of a total sum of Rs. 9,100 provided in the budget, the expenditure amounted to Rs. 1,942-4-0 during the year.





SIR,

I have the honor to forward herewith the report on the working of the Government Museum for the year 1930-31.

2. Visitors.—There were 2,07,028 visitors to the Museum during the year as against 2,40,566 in the previous year. The fall in the number may be attributed to the absence in this year of the large crowds during "Karaga" of previous years, and the closing of the Museum for nearly a month on account of repairs and improvements to the building.

Of the number of visitors, 1,20,279 were males, 85,751 females and 992 school children. Compared to other days, the crowds during "Karaga" and on some of the

local feasts were large.

Twelve thousand eight hundred and sixteen or a little more than six per cent wrote their names in the "Visitors Book". Details are furnished in Appendix "D".

- 3. Building.—The building was maintained in good condition and the interior was whitewashed. To improve the lighting inside the building, ten small windows in the top were replaced by larger sized ones. The colored ornamental glasses fixed to the side doors were also substituted with plain glasses. There is still need for better lighting and it can be supplied by the introduction overhead lights in the central roof as I have already recommended in my report.
- 4. Collection.—The collections were kept in good condition and 76 exhibits following under the marginally noted heads were added during the year. Details are furnished in Appendix "B."
- 5. Library.—Seven books were added besides the departmental and other reports and bulletins usually received. There were 102 readers in the Library.
- 6. Maintenance.—The Government grant for the maintenance of the Museum was Rs. 7,000 for the year 1930-31 and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 5,921-6-3. Details are furnished in Appendix "C."







SIR,

I have the honor to submit the report on the working of the Government Museum for the year 1931-32 and to request that 100 copies may kindly be arranged to be supplied for distribution to other Museums.

2. Personnel.—Mr. G. H. Krumbiegel, Director of Horticulture, continued to be in charge of the Department till the end of the official year when he retired from service.

3. Visitors.—During the year under report, the Museum was visited by 2,67,757 persons, of whom 1,49,495 were males, 1,16,634 females and 1,628 school-children.

A little over five per cent of the total number of visitors (13,932) wrote their names in the Visitors' Book.

As usual, there were large crowds during 'Karaga' and on some other local feasts and festivals. Details are furnished in Appendix A.

- 4. Building.—Sundry repairs to the building were carried out by the Department of Public Works which has been requested to provide the ventilators on some of the doorways with cross-bars.
- 5. Furniture. The showcases and other articles of furniture were maintained in good condition. A teakwood stand and a wallcase were got made during the year.
- 6. Collection.—The collection remained on the whole in good condition and 96 exhibits under the following heads were acquired during the year:—
- (a) Zoology.—A major portion of the zoological collections continue to be old and a dozen moth-eaten and otherwise worn-out birds and a large number of insects were removed.

One Nilghai and a Cat-bear were received from Sri Chamarajendra Zoological Gardens, Mysore, and a Flying Squirrel was purchased.

Two Pigeons and one Myna were added to the Bird collection.

A damaged Rat-snake and an old Monitor were replaced by fresh specimens.

A collection of Grass-hoppers and Moths was purchased.

(b) Agriculture.—Twenty-five coloured pictures showing the development of some of the Agricultural products in Mysore were purchased.

- (c) Archæology.—An old gun with an arabic inscription was received from the Superintendent of Police, Tumkur.
- (d) Coins.—Ten gold South Indian Fanams and one silver Tippu's rupee found in certain villages of Coimbatore, Trichinopoly, South Arcot Districts and Cochin State were obtained from among those available for distribution in the Madras Museum.
- (e) Arts and Industries.—With a view to improve the Industrial section, the question of reviving the sale of Mysore Artware articles in the Museum was taken up and the Director of Industries was requested to transfer some articles from the Mysore Arts and Crafts Institute for exhibition and sale.
- 7. Labelling.—The provision of printed labels in the Geological section was completed during the year and some of the manuscript labels in the Fish, and Shells and Corals galleries were replaced with printed ones.
- 8. Library.—Nine books, besides the Administration Reports of the Departments of Government of Mysore and of other Museums, were added.
- 9. The Cases were gone through and cleaning and re-arranging wherever necessary were attended to. The General Stock Register, Registers of Exhibits, furniture and books are written up-to-date.
- 10. Maintenance.—For the year under report, the Government grant for the maintenance of the Museum was Rs. 4,900 and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 4,208-1-0. The saving is due to the amount intended to meet the cost of mounting a large Lion and a Cat-bear received from the Mysore Chamarajendra Zoological Gardens, not having been utilised before the end of the year owing to the non-completion of the work in time. The statement of receipts and expenditure is furnished in Appendix D.




