## Minutes of the Meet of North East Resource Persons at IGNCA, New Delhi 7-8 August, 2008

As desired a two-day meet of resource persons from North east was organized at IGNCA, New Delhi on August 7-8, 2008. The major objectives of the meet were to evaluate the work done by the IGNCA team in past 9-10 months; develop strategy for organizing the Spirit of North East in New Delhi on November 19, 2008; identify the projects and activities for the year 2008-09; and also to identify the institutions and individuals for implementing and coordinating the projects.

In order to expedite the above, Joint Secretary held a meeting with scholars - Dr. Richa Negi and Dr. Kailash Kumar Mishra – associated with North-east Program on 28.07.08. She asked them to prepare an agenda for the meeting and also to visit Sangeet Natak Akademi, Lalit Kala Akademi and JNU to collect a list of resource people working in North-east. She also discussed the activities listed for future activities one by one and suggested to drop some of them in order to avoid repetition.

Member Secretary's also took a meeting at his office on 29.07.2008 to discuss the parameters for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> August and to plan the *Spirit of North-east* for November 2008 with the following members.

Member Secretary suggested that the planning of the event should be systematic so that different categories may be divided and classified thematically. He added that the 'Spirit

of North-east', must include local inputs by the people. The nature-culture relationship should be the main focus of the program.

The meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> August was chaired by Dr. K. K. Chakravarty, Member Secretary IGNCA. The day began with the introduction of the activities that the IGNCA Team has done in past 9-10 months by Dr. Richa Negi. She informed that IGNCA in collaboration with the Government Departments, institutions, community resource persons, social animators, university departments, local experts and scholars has launched several of activities in North Eastern States of India to research, document, publish, promote, preserve, revitalize and safeguard the tangible and intangible cultural resources including the human heritage of the region. More than 33 tribes are documented; around 1000 books are obtained; 1100 ethnographic items are procured; 250 Hours' audio-visual documentation is ready; about 175 forms of dance and songs are recorded; the oral history of tribes and people are getting ready in book form and the process is on with the other communities and tribes; festivals and rituals of various tribes and communities are recorded and documented; rare books and manuscripts are digitized and preserved; indigenous methods of preservation and conservation are recorded; popularized and their usefulness is evaluated using the modern techniques of preservation and conservation; customary laws are documented; unprotected and protected archaeological and heritage sites are documented; attempts are made to create the physiognomy of the folk deities and narratives and to create mental atlas accordingly. Dr Negi gave a brief introduction about all the North East States including Sikkim.

Going back to the last week of May 2007 Dr. Richa Negi said that initially a team comprising of Prof. A. C. Bhagabati, Shri P. Jha, Dr. G. Badam, Sri Virendra Bangroo, Shri Seetharamiah, Shjri Iliyas Ahmad, Dr. Richa Negi and Dr. Kailash Kumar Mishra made an extensive study tour to Assam and Arunachal Pradesh under the leadership and vision of Dr. K. K. Chakravarty organized some workshops and met institutions,

authorities of the universities, administrators, monasteries, craft persons, etc. and from that we did not look back.

As desired by the Chair, each participant introduced himself/herself with specialization and interest. After this Professor A. C. Bhagabati gave an overview of the activities done in past 10 months.

Dr. K. K. Chakravarty requested the resource persons to work on the strategy of organizing Spirit of North east on 19<sup>th</sup> November 2008 at IGNCA, New Delhi. The participants discussed the issues as mentioned in the agenda paper given below:

## 1. Spirit of North East (19 -28 November, 2008 at IGNCA, New Delhi)

- 1.1 Customary laws, dispute resolution and reconciliation, human and natural resource management strategies
- 1.2 Indigenous and dying games and Sports
- 1.3 Revisiting Colonial History
- 1.4 Role of Women and their Contribution: freedom struggles, creativity, entrepreneurship, self governance, monasteries (e.g. Ani from Ani Gompa of Arunachal Pradesh and women from Namghar, Assam)
- 1.5 People's intervention for preservation, promotion and documentation of cultural heritage
- 1.6 Working with *sattradhikaris* to discuss an exhibition on the history, heritage, culture, arts, including music and architecture, and oral history of *sattras*, including *kalasattras*, *sattras* managed by women, the *namghar* tradition
- 1.7 Bio-cultural diversity and the role of cultural practices in maintaining the biocultural harmony
- 1.8 Preparation and Design of catalogue for Spirit of North East
- 1.9 Publication of Books, Modules, CDs, etc.
- 2. Identification of areas/ cultural pockets for initiating new activities
- 3. Identification of collaborators
- 4. Identification of institutions and individuals who have done audiovisual documentation so that IGNCA can digitize such institutional (and individual) holdings and share products with them

- 5. Organizing capacity building workshops for the conservation of manuscripts, objects or any form of artifacts and also to access, learn and revive the traditional and indigenous methods of conservation
- 6. Explore further collaborative activities with the Government of the States of North East India to appreciate and develop culture as a constitutive element in development in consultation with officials and individuals

## 7. Discussion on MOUs

It was unanimously decided to organize the event on Spirit of North East in a big way. It was agreed upon that it should be entirely different from other events generally organized by various institutions and agencies. The following lines of action were also discussed by the participants:

- 1. A multi-media presentation on exhibition of the rare and illustrated manuscripts; films by the people of North-east; ethnographic artifacts collected and acquired.
- 2. Textile of North East & its live presentation.
- 3. Various ethnic cuisines of North East India.
- 4. Spirit of women throughout indigenous, socio cultural lifestyle of North East region.
- Shankari culture (the tradition initiated by Srimanta Sankardeva, a 16<sup>th</sup> century Vaisnava saint reformer of Assam) with special reference to Sattras of Assam including illustrated manuscripts.
- 6. Depiction of Buddhism of North East Region.
- 7. Rare books & manuscripts, films on North East.
- 8. Traditional musical instruments of North East.
- 9. Performance of various priestly chanting and folk narratives.
- 10. Indigenous and dying sports and games
- 11. Bamboo based heritage and culture of North East (including landscaping).
- 12. Workshop on customary laws, oral history, women issues, etc.

On August 8, 2008 the participants were asked to finalize and prioritize the projects to be undertaken in the financial year of 2008-09. A list of 83 proposals was discussed and finally following proposals were tentatively approved by Member Secretary in consultation with the participants.
