over a multi-projected *pista* of 0.90 mtrs high.

Ornamentation

Exteriors : The pista is decorated with khakharamundis

enshrining royal figures, female divinities, vidala over a pair of elephants etc. Different form of nayikas such as Salabhanjikas, Nupurapadikas, Darpanas, Sarikas, Vinabadikas, Chamaradharis, Alasakanyas, etc in tribhanga pose is found in the conjunction of the khakharamundis in the pista. The decorative motifs like- scroll work, beaded border, lattice pattern, miniature chaitya motifs, etc also found in the pista. The vimana has pidhamundis over the parsvadevatas

niches.

Interiors : A four- armed image of Trivikrama is kept inside the

jagamohana.
