south.

### Ornamentation

Exteriors

The temple is decorated with dopichhasimhas, deulacharinis and beki-Bhairava over the beki of both the vimana and jagamohana; nayika figures are fixed as a bracket type in between the bada and the gandi of the jagamohana; two projecting lion having a gap of 1.50 mtrs on each raha and pidhamundi design over the

parsvadevata niches.

Interiors : A standing image of Ganesa and a four-armed standing

Visnu are attached to the inner walls of the jagamohana.

Movable Collections : A large number of fragmentary sculptures such as-

Astikajaratkaru, Ganesa, femal figures, *nagi* image, Hara-Parvati, etc are attached to the compound wall. Besides, several Sivalingas are also placed inside the

compound.
