Exteriors : Decorated with architectural motifs like – elongated

rekhamundis in the pagas of the vimana, both the tala garbhika and urdha garbhika are in the rekhamundi design; decorative motifs such as-lattice pattern, scroll work; secular motifs like linga puja, fighting scenes, mithuna, maithuna images, lion; semi-divinities like graha panel in the parsvadevata nich of Kartikeya etc in the vimana. The jagamohana is decorated with the images of Uma-Mahesvara, Hanuman, a two-armed Kartikeya, a four-armed sitting Ganesa, a four-armed standing Bhiksatana Parvati, murty of Ravananugraha *murty*, a musician, *mithunas*, a horse, milching of a cow, etc which were collected from other places and fixed on the bada. Dopichhasimhas and Deulacharinis above the beki of the vimana and the

jagamohana to support the amlaka.
