## Ornamentation

Exteriors The cave is devoid of sculptural friezes except the

pillar and pilaster. The pillars are based over a three steped pedestal and square at the base and at the top and octagonal at the center. The existing bracket of the pillar in the interior side is designed with lion, a royal elephant flanked by two other elephant one holding umbrella and the other a fly whisk. The central pillar dis esigned with a

enigmatic winged animal.

The pilaster on the left side of the cave is relived with an elephand tied with nagapasa and the right one has a scene of a male holding a female in his

one hand and a elephant tusk in other hand.

The lower storey floor has been exploited by stone quarrying in the early medieval time, which damaged the aesthetic beauty of the cave.
