Budha in *bhumisparsamudra* over a double petalled lotus pedestal. His right hand touches the earth, where as the left hand in the lap & the palm is facing upwards. The Budha image is flanked by decorative motif such as lion, *jagrata* motif, elephant *makaramukha*, creeper on either side and a *bodhi* tree represented behind his head. The whole image rests over a pedestal which is *pancharatha* on plan. It is carved with a rampant lion at the centre and flanked by an elephant and *bharabahaka* on either side. The image measures 1.64 mtrs x 1.26 mtrs x 0.35 mtrs in length, width & thickness respectively.
