> and pidhamundis in the talajangha and uparajangha respectively. Miniature rekhamundis in the anuratha paga just above the varanda and three miniature rekhamundis surmounted the urdhagarbhika of the raha niches. *Udyotasimha* is present only in the western *raha*.

Traces of dikpalas and their consorts are also found.

compound wall whereas the doorjambs of both the vimana and jagamohana, udyotasimha are in sandstone. Traces of lime plaster also present on the exterior of the temple.
