rekha temple adjoining to the western wall which houses a four-armed standing Visnu holding wheel in upper right, varada mudra in lower right, conch in upper left and mace in the lower left hand. Female devotees flanking the god in the lower part whereas flying vidyadhara on the top. The other temple houses a two-armed Kartikeya sitting over his mount peacock, holding an arrow in the right hand and an unidentified object (bell?) in the right hand and flying vidyadhara

flanking the god at the top.

**Building Techniques** : Ashlar dry masonry.

Material of Construction : Sandstone is used for the construction of the temple

and the entire surface is thickly plastered and red

washed.
