Exteriors : Decorated with architectural motifs such as-

vajramundis in the jangha of the vimana, projecting lion surmounted over a mastaka design on the gandi of the jagamohana; decorative motifs like - miniature chaitya design housing lotus in the basanta moulding of the pabhaga, kirtimukha, makara, ghatapallava, padmaprosta design and chaitya motifs with or without human head or kirtimukha on the gandi, scroll motifs and double- chaitya medallion on each raha, bird and animal motif like- goose, peacocks, lions and

elephants etc.
