Interiors : The pillar brackets decorated with *nayikas*, honey-

suckles and lotus flanked by elephant and elephant – riders in the pilasters bracket. The doors decorated with *ghatapallava* pilasters surmounted by semi-circle arches carved with gooses, lions, humans, honey suckles, snakes, bull trees etc. The cells facade decorated with railings votive *chaityas*, flying semi-divine figures etc. The rear wall of the cells decorated with an unfinished *Tirthankara* flanked by *chauri* bearers and flying *vidyadharas* and surmounted by *Nandipada* and *Swastika*

symbol.
