Plan Allocation of Spaces ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Ornamentation Exteriors The Asokan edicts below the forepart of the rock-cut elephant here furnish the standard version of rock edicts I to X and XIV by replacing rock edicts XI, XII & XIII with two special edicts which are also repeated in the Asokan inscription at Jaugada (Ganjam district) in ancient Kalinga. The forepart of the elephant is labelled Gajatme, symbolizing the conception of the Buddha shows craftsmanship and sculptural features of royal Mauryan art flourished under the patronization of emperor Asoka.
