Decorated with architectural motifs likekhakharamundis flanked by ascending naga-nagi pilasters over the dual gajakranta in the pabhaga; khakharamundis housing different form of nayikas in tribhanga pose and dikpalas in the lower jangha; pidhamundis adorned with dikpalikas in the kanika pagas, royal lady, elephant rider, devotee worshipping Lingam, divinities like Laxmi, Visnu, etc in the upper jangha; decorative motifs such as chaitva motif, makaramukha, elephant procession, beaded border, scroll work, lattice pattern, etc in the bada; balustrade window ornamented with navika figures on the northern and southern walls; images of mithuna, maithuna and gaja-vidalas in the recess of upper and lower *iangha* respectively. The dooriambs have three sakhas- lata, nara, puspa from interior to exterior and khakharamundis at the base housing dvarapala figures

and Gaja-Laxmi in the lintel.

Interiors : Plain

Movable Collections : An image of a two-armed Ekapada Bhairava is kept

close to the southern wall of the *jagamohana*. The deity is standing over a lotus pedestal having tri-foil arch at the back and a pair of flying Vidyadhara at the

top.

panchangabada in elevation.
