Ornamentation

Exteriors : Decorated with architectural motifs like-

khakharamundis in the talajangha, pidhamundis in the uparajangha, succession of two miniature rekha temples in the anuratha pagas, replica of rekhadeula and projecting lion in all raha paga except the frontal raha in which two miniature rekha temples flaking a pidha type motif at the level of varanda. Deulacharinis

supported the beki-amala over the frontal raha.

Interiors : The porch is open in all the sides with its doorways

distinguished by decorated arches. The interior ceiling of the porch is carved with lotus design. The oversailing courses of the ceiling on the west depict Anantasayi- Visnu and the scene of the marriage of Siva with Parvati; while the northern face is relived with

a procession of infantry and elephants.
