Exteriors : Decorated with architectural motifs such as khakhara

mundis and pidhamundis in the talajangha and uparajanga respectively, a series of four miniature angasikharas in the anuratha pagas, three rekhamundis in the central raha, talagarbhika in khakhara design flanked by naga-nagi pilasters; divinities and semi-divinities like- Ganesa, Mahisasura mardini Durga, Siva, dikpalas; conjuction of the pagas adorned with nayika of different forms such as Salabhanjika, Chauri-bearer, etc in the upper jangha and gaja-vidalas and nara-vidalas in the talajangha. The other motifs are scroll work, padmaprosta, etc. and dopichasimhas and beki-bhairava over the beki to

support the amala.
