A flight of stairs leads to the temple gate which has a pyramidcal or pagoda style shikhar with medallion motives on its frieze. It has a mandapa with slightly domical spire and two lateral transepts on either side On sanctum-Santorum a typical shikhar have been constructed. Inside the sanctum 'Grabhgriha' standing statue of a Jain saint has been installed. The entire structure is cladded with marble slabs.
