The roofing to the mukha-mandapa and the mandapa has completely disappeared and know replaced by wild growth. This temple has the sanctum and its shikhar somewhat intact. The "jangha" and the projection still hold the carvings and the 'rathika' and 'bhadrika' formations. The pinnacle of the shikar has fallen down but the "anghshikhars" and 'karnshikars' suggest the elaboration of carving and planning that want into the making of this temple.
