The entrance to the temple is through a door studded with decorative iron- grills. The projected chhajjas are supported by stone brackets. The temple has a bulbous dome surmounted by an inverted lotus type of pinnacle. Rajasthani frescos of 'Dwarpalas' adorn the entrance. The main shrine has marble statue of 'Nandi' facing towards 'shivlinga'. A marble statue of 'shiva' is placed on a raised platform flanked by other subordinate deities.
