Structural System The tomb is raised upon a chabutra 4.1 m high and 50. 6 sq. m, on each front of which are 17 arches. The central arch on the south forms an entrance into the central underground chamber containing the grave of Khan- i- Khana. The tomb proper raised in centre of the terrace is 26.3 sq. m externally. The façade on each front is broken by a great arched recess. Flanking this central bay there are small arched recess on both storeys. Over the raised central bay stands the great double dome flanked at the four corners by octagonal chattris.
