





To celebrate International Day of Yoga on June 21st, 2019, Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts put together a huge presentation called YOGA NRITYA, a culmination of expert led workshops on the confluence of Yoga and Classical Dance.

This presentation organised by Kaladarsana Division gave an insight into the practice of the Indian Classical Dance linked with the concept of Yoga. This stage performance was a conclusion of a series of expert-led workshops on Classical Indian Dance and Music over a period of two months from May 2019.

The workshops were organised at IGNCA to draw parallels between yoga and the creative arts. Dance and music like any other art form, are such expressions that keep the mind stimulated, and in their process of creativity, enhance concentration and discipline. They have many overlapping qualities with Yoga, of meditation, awareness and

relaxation that are therapeutic for the mind, body and soul. With the guidance of expert Gurus, these two-month long weekend classes introduced a new dance form on each day to the participants.



Applied Natya Therapy Integrating Science & Arts for Mental Health through Bharatamuni's Natyashastra

IGNCA - Nari Samvaad Prakalp (NSP) and Regional Centre, Ranchi (RCR) organized a five day long workshop based on an ongoing project of NSP titled 'Applied Natya Therapy' (ANT) in collaboration with Department of Performing Arts, Ranchi University (RU) from April 29th to May 3rd, 2019.

The workshop held at Shaheed Smriti Sabhagar Auditorium of Ranchi University was inaugurated by Prof. R.K. Pandey, VC, RU in presence of Prof. Kamini Kumar, Pro VC, RU, faculty members, students of RU and other officials of RCR, IGNCA. During the inaugural session, Dr. Sushma Jatoo, Project Director, NSP spoke about the aims and objectives of IGNCA along with those of NSP, which has been revived by Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi, MS, IGNCA in the year 2017. She further mentioned that the 'Applied Natya Therapy' is an interdisciplinary project integrating both Science and Arts, and aims at a thorough understanding of the prescriptions of Bharatmunis Natyashastra for creating therapeutic and healing modality for mental health. classical dancer gave an introduction to the five day workshop along with the topics of Natya-shastra that the workshop would focus on.

Recreating The Bharatiya Itihasa: Select Sanskrit Inscriptions

A five day national workshop on 'Recreating The Bharatiya Itihasa: Select Sanskrit Inscriptions' was inaugurated at Kalakshetra Foundation, Chennai on the 2nd June, 2019. The program was conceptualized under the Bharat Vidya Prayojana of IGNCA and was executed at Chennai in the active association of the Kalakshetra Foundation. Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu, Shri Banwarilal Purohit, His Holiness Jagadguru Shankara Vijayendra Sarasvati Shankaracharya, Svami of Kanchi Mutt, Chairman. Kalakshetra Foundation, Padma Bhushan Dr. N. Gopalaswami, and Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi, MS, IGNCA, were present during the occasion along with eminent scholar and chief resource person for the workshop, Padma Bhushan Dr. R. Nagaswamy. The inaugural function was held in the majestic Rukmini Arangam of the Kalakshetra Foundation. Noted luminaries of Chennai like Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam. Trustee, IGNCA and several heads of academic bodies of Tamil Nadu were also present. A small exhibition on inscriptions was also organized outside the hall by the State Epigraphy Department.

The programme began with ritualistic welcome of Jagadguru with purna kumbha followed by the arrival of Hon'ble Governor. Dr. R. Nagaswamy in his welcome address reflected upon the significance and scope of the workshop. Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi gave a special address in which he dilated upon the various academic activities of the IGNCA, especially the Bharat Vidya Prayojana, the project on Riverine Culture and the Epigraphy workshops. His address provided the appropriate context to the workshop, as he stressed on the urgent need to deliver a correct historical narrative. Dr. N. Gopalaswami welcomed the collaboration of IGNCA for this workshop and spoke about the importance of epigraphs and the nature of our culture. He also highlighted some

amazing achievements and thoughts of our ancestors. The 11th volume of Sanskrit inscriptions brought out by the Uttankita Vidyaranya trust was also released by the Jagadguru.

Later the Hon'ble Governor addressed the gathering, in which he pointed towards the importance of organising such workshops. He also spoke about the history of epigraphs in India and highlighted their significance. It was followed by the anugraha bhashanam (benedictory address) of the Jagadguru. Showering his blessings on all present, he gave an insight into Maha Periava's deep interest in epigraphy. Jagadguru also stated that the study of Sanskrit and Sanskriti are interrelated and should be encouraged.

Dr. Sudhir Lall presented the vote of thanks in which he stated that this session was a unique amalgamation of dharmashasana, rajashasana, shastrashasana and kalashasana. He stated that the workshop has been designed as a rigorous training module to train youngsters to read ancient inscriptions. Director of Kalakshetra Foundation, Vidushi Dr. Revathi Ramachandran and her entire team lent extremely positive support to IGNCA as collaborator and it was duly acknowledged.

From 3rd to 6th June, 2019, extensive sessions were taken by resource persons, which included Dr. R. Nagaswamy, Dr. T. S. Ravi Shankar, Dr. K. Munirathnam, Dr. Suraj Pandit, Dr. Ambarish Khare, Dr. Sushmita Basu, Dr. Ramadevi, Dr. Chitra Madhavan, Ms. Bakialakshmi & Dr. T. Sathyamurthy. A total of fifty participants attended the workshop, out of which nineteen were from different parts of the country and rest were local. The participants were also introduced to the concept of in-situ decipherment as they were taken around for local field visits to museums and temples nearby.


International Museum Day Celebration

Every year since 1977, International Council of Museums (ICOM) has organized International Museum Day (IMD) on 18th May, to raise awareness of Museums as an important means of cultural exchange, enrichment of culture and development of mutual understanding, cooperation and peace among people. IMD 2019 focused on the theme "Museums as cultural hubs: the future of tradition". Under the aegis of IMD 2019, IGNCA organized following programs to offer a platform for translating local communities' needs and views into a national context.

Play: Yakshini

IGNCA organized "Yakshini" play directed by Ms. Sunita Bharti on IMD 2019 to educate the audience and to create awareness among people at large, about our rich heritage and their importance.

It is the first play in Hindi literature on an antique archeological relic, the 'Didarganj Chowry Bearer Female Figure', popularly known as 'Didarganj Yakshini', written by Shri Arvind Kumar. This Mauryan antiquity, dating back to 300 BC, currently exhibited in Patna Museum, is the first life sized female figurine sculpted in Indian archaeological time line. This play is the pioneer instance of application of theatre in public Museology and education which consists of two acts. In act-one, story of its excavation and retrieval has been fabricated in an entertaining manner around the documented facts with all real characters of 1917

episode. Here, the writer has made a logical surmise of what the villagers would have thought of this image on the basis of traditional belief and cult-practices. In act-two of the play, a fictitious story portraying a sculptor, a model and the circumstances leading to the sculpting of this masterpiece in 300 BC has been fabricated within the limits of the historical facts and the epoch of time, aiming to blend the creative imagination of audience to comprehend the epoch of the time and historicity of this sculpture. While felicitating the performers, Shri Daya Prakash Sinha, Trustee IGNCA urged that this play might inspire people to explore on other such heritages, pulling a larger section of public to museums with enhanced interest in antiquities.

A national seminar on Rock Art research in India was organised from 2nd to 4th May, 2019 at IGNCA, New Delhi as a part of Dr. V. S. Wakankar Centenary celebrations. The seminar was inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Prof. Nageshwar Rao (VC, IGNOU), Keynote Speaker, Prof. Susmita Pande (Former Chairperson, National Monument Authority), Shri Baba Yogendra Ji (Patron and Founder Member, Sanskar Bharti) and Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi (MS, IGNCA). Thereafter, a brochure for the seminar was also released.

Prof. Susmita Pande in her keynote address elaborated on rock art as a documentary of our history and culture. Prof. Nageshwar Rao and Shri Baba Yogendra Ji in their address recollected the memories by discussing the remarkable contributions of Dr. V. S. Wakankar. Dr. Joshi in his speech discussed about Dr. V. S. Wakankar's multifaceted personality and emphasised on the urgency & needs of commencement of courses on rock art studies at IGNCA.

The session's presentations concluded with fruitful discussions by eminent scholars. In the valedictory session, most of the scholars shared their valuable suggestions and some recommendations were also proposed for carrying out further research activities in the rock art studies of India, which includes: workshop and seminar should be separately organised on megalithic art in India; Archaeo-astrology studies has to be undertaken on megalithic sites; rock art workshop in the vicinity of the rock art site itself facilitating on the spot demonstration of associated objects to archaeo-

logists and the public at large; if possible, a comprehensive annual journal should be released which should include various aspects of rock art in India and abroad. A proper editorial board should be formed for this purpose. There was a consensus to revive the journal "Shaila Chitra" started by Dr. V. S. Wakankar; regional seminars, awareness programmes and annual conference in collaboration with various institutions, schools and colleges should be organised.

A uniform standardised form should be developed to document the rock art sites of India systematically. Online bibliography and data-bank to be developed that may help the scholars from all over the country; focus should be on resolving the chronological issues and dating of rock art sites by doing multi-disciplinary study and training should be given on new scientific application that may help on capacity building; local people should be made aware about the importance of rock art site for preservation and conservation. Awareness should be spread among the forest department officials also so that the sites can be preserved from vandalism.

An exclusive exhibition on "The Legacy of Dr. Vishnu Shridhar Wakankar" from 2nd to 30th May, 2019 was also showcased.

Exhibition on World Environment Day



To raise awareness and protect the environment, the employees of Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts came together to celebrate World Environment Day. Special highlights of this exhibition were art works made out of waste material lying in stock on the campus of IGNCA.

The project was conceptualised and initiated by Kaladarsana Division with an effort to bring about a change at an institutional level by engaging the employees working here. Visual imagery in the form of photographs, paintings, installations on the environment was invited from staff members across departments.

Shri Niraj Patel, an installation artist was invited to create artworks out of waste materials. He created huge installations using left-over metal frames and woods that would have otherwise been auctioned as waste. He used symbolic imagery to bring attention to vertically growing lifeless cities with barely any space for ecosystems. Artworks representing trees, birds and fishes signified natural life and threats to their existence were prepared.



Photographs of the monuments affected by air pollution


They were reflective of continuous and endless concrete development with dismal importance to bio-network and our dependence on them.


Some contribution of IGNCA staffs are worth mentioning. The photographs of Ms. Srishti (Kaladarsana) depicted the

constant construction and development, posing a threat to depletion of natural surroundings. Ms. Devika (Kaladarsana) created digital posters to highlight the consequen-ces of water and air pollution. Ms. Simran (Bharat Vidya Prayojana) painted scenes replete with barrenness and negligent signs of life, indicative of the emotions related to the effects of air pollution and global warming. Ms. Arushi (Kaladarsana) photographs were commentaries on the hazardous damages

posed to monuments due to environ-mental factors including air pollution. Mr. Rahul (Kaladarsana) put together an installation of small sculptures to depict experts and news readers endlessly in conversation, yet are able to do little at ground level. Dr. Achal Pandya, head of conservation unit contributed a Compost Bin made out of the waste at IGNCA, which was also on display in the gallery. International Workshop on Digital Archiving

An "International Workshop on Digital Archiving" was organized by IGNCA, New Delhi, in collaboration with Computational Resources on South Asian Languages (CoRSAL), University of Texas, USA, & Imasi: The Maharaj Kumari Binodini Devi Foundation from 10th-12th June 2019. This is in connection with the UNESCO 2003 Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH) with first domain: Oral tradition and expression, including language as vehicle of ICH.

The workshop was Inaugurated by Chief Guest Shri Pranav Khullar, DG, National Archives of India and Guests of Honour Mr. Herzekiel Dlamini, Advisor for Communication and Information UNESCO, New Delhi. The workshop began with Shri Pranav Khullar's detailed information and importance about Internet Ramanujan Archive. The delegates were from institutes like CoRSAL, University of Texas, USA, Dept. of Linguistic, Gauhati University, Guwahati, Assam, Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage, INTACH, Tripura, Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy, CCRH etc. The workshop's main objectives were:

To enhance the capacity of participants' data digitization, data cleaning, data naming and data publishing techniques, and to promote best tools for data preventing and accessioning;

इन्दिरा गाँधी राष्ट्रीय कला केन्द्र 'संस्कृति सम्वाद शुंखला' के माध्यम से भारतीय ज्ञान पररम्परा के सांस्कृतिक सम्वादों को न सिर्फ पुन: स्थापित कर रहा है परन्तु भारतीयता को समृद्ध करने वाले महापुरुषों, मनीषियों के अवदान को प्रतिष्ठित करने का कार्य भी कर रहा है। लगभग तीन वर्ष पूर्व से प्रारम्भ यह आयोजन अनेक विभित्तयों को सम्मानित करता रहा है।

इस शुंखला के ग्यारहवें संस्करण में इस बार प्रखर विचारक, चिन्तक और समाज सेवी श्री गोविन्दाचार्य के 75 वर्ष होने पर अभिनंदन किया गया। कार्यक्रम के मुख्यातिथि गुजरात के राज्यपाल महामहिम श्री ओमप्रकाश कोहली ने कहा कि जो लोग गोविन्दाचार्च को निकट से जानते हैं वे ही इस पर विचार करें कि गोविन्द जी बेहतर राजनेता साबित होते या बेहतर सामाजिक कार्यकर्ता हैं। उन्होंने कहा कि सत्ता और राजनीति केवल ऊपरी तौर पर परिवर्तन का काम कर सकती है। वास्तव में परिवर्तन तो सामाजिक कार्यकर्ताओं और सामाजिक आंदोलनों के माध्यम से आता है, गोविन्दाचार्य वहीं काम कर रहे हैं। वे सामाजिक विवेचना में रुचि रखते हैं। उनकी विशेषता है कि वह लीक से हटकर अपनी बात कहते हैं। उन्होंने हमेशा मूल्यों और मुद्दों को पटरी पर लाने की कोशिश की है। केन्द्र के अध्यक्ष श्री रामबहादुर राय ने अपने वक्तव्य में कहा कि हम महात्मा गाँधी का 150वाँ जयंती उत्सव मना रहे हैं और इसी साल गोविन्दाचार्य 75 साल पूरा कर रहे हैं। इन दोनों में अनेक समानताये हैं। गाँधी जी भी मूलत: राजनीतिक थे और गोविन्दाचार्य भी हैं। भारत के स्वाधीनता के संग्राम और गरीब असहायों के उत्थान का संघर्ष गाँधी जी की राजनीति थी। गोविन्दाचार्य भी इसी मायने में राजनीतिक हैं। ऐसी राजनीति को लोगों को समझने


की जरूरत है। दूसरी समानता है गाँधी जी की सक्ति 'ऐसे जिओ जैसे कल मरना है और सीखने जुनून इस तरह रखो जैसे तुम्हें हमेशा जिंदा रहना है'। गोविन्द जी के विचार के तत्त्व में भी ऐसी कई बातें समाहित अपने अभिनन्दन समारोह में बोलते हुए श्री गोविन्दाचार्य ने कहा कि आपने जिस

श्री गोविन्दाचार्य पर केन्द्रित यह आयोजन मूलत: दो विषयों पर आधारित था 'भारत का स्वधर्म एवं राजव्यवस्था' और 'प्रकृति केन्द्रित विकास' जो विषय गोविन्द जी के कार्यों का आधार भी है। अत: इन विषयों पर बोलने के लिये इन पर गहरी पकड़ और समझ रखनेवाले गणमान्य वक्ताओं ने भाग लिया। 'भारत का स्वधर्म एवं राजव्यवस्था' पर वरिष्ठ पत्रकार एवं माखनलाल विश्वविद्यालय के पूर्वकलपति श्री



पुस्तक विमोचन करते हुये बायें से श्री सिच्चिदानन्द जोशी, श्री ब्रजेश झा, श्री मनोज झा, श्री रामबहादुर राय, श्री प्रभात महामहिम श्री ओमप्रकाश कोहली, श्री गोविन्दाचार्य एवं श्री अच्युतानन्द मिश्र

अच्युतानंद मिश्र ने कहा कि गोविन्दाचार्य जी गाँधीजी के चिन्तन की ही तरह इस चिन्तन के प्रतीक माने जाते हैं। भारतीय समाज को लेकर गोविन्द जी की जो अवधारणा रही है गाँधीजी की भी वही अवधारणा रही है। उन्होंने कहा स्वधर्म और राजव्यवस्था दो शब्द है और दो संकल्पनायें भी है। मनीषियों का मानना है कि भारत के स्वधर्म का आधार भारतीय समाज है और इस भारतीय समाज की नींव नैतिकता है इसीलिए समाज को नैतिक तथा मजबूत बनाये रखने मं, इस संस्कृति का पूर्ण योगदान है। स्वाधीनता के बाद जिस तरह की राजव्यवस्था और समाज होना

चाहिये था, वह नहीं है, इसके लिये समाज को मजबूत करना होगा। उसके दुष्परिणाम स्वरुप भारतीय राजनीति में जैसे लोग आने चाहिये थे, वे नहीं आये। इसी संकल्पना के साथ गोविन्द जी 2002 के बाद राजनीति से अलग होकर समाज को मजबूत बनाने में लगे हैं।

वरिष्ठ समाजवादी चिन्तक प्रो. आनन्द कुमार ने कहा कि आज स्वराज और लोकतन्त्र का अर्थ वर्चस्व हो गया है। यही भाव स्वराज को तोड रहा है, उसको आतंकमय बना रहा है। अत: लोकतन्त्र में बहस की प्रासंगिकता है साथ ही उस प्रासंगिकता में गोविन्दाचार्य जैसे व्यक्ति के आत्मकथन का और भी आकर्षण है। मोतिहारी विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति प्रो. संजीव शर्मा ने कहा गोविन्द जी के अनुसार स्वधर्म और राजव्यवस्था दोनों के नैतिक मुल्यों में सुधार मुलरूप से अनिवार्य है। वरिष्ठ पत्रकार श्री राहुल देव ने कहा कि स्वभाव की समझ से स्वधर्म की समझ आयेगी और उस समझ से ही सुकर्म कर सकेंगे। आज की राजव्यवस्था भारत के स्वभाव से विपरीत है और यही भारतीय समाज के लिये गहरी चुनौती है। गाँधीवादी विचारक श्री पवन गुप्त ने कहा कि हम एक जख्मी समाज हैं और हम जख्मी इस तरह से हैं की हम सहज नहीं रहे। इस कमी पर बात होनी चाहिए और इसे दर करना चाहिए। गोविन्द जी के करीबी श्री जितेन्द्र बजाज ने उनके साथ के अपने कई संस्मरण सुनाये और कहा कि उनमें अद्भुत सम्पर्क क्षमता के धनी हैं। यह क्षमता दिव्य सन्तों में ही मिलती है। इनकी राजनीति. व्यक्तियों के साथ सरोकारों वाली राजनीति है। सत्रीय अध्यक्ष सिक्किम के पूर्व राज्यपाल श्री बाल्मिकी प्रसाद सिंह ने कहा कि हमारा स्वधर्म श्रुति और स्मृति परम्परा पर आधारित है। प्रजातन्त्र की रक्षा हेत् हर तरह के बलिदान को तैयार रहना. हमारा स्वधर्म होना चाहिये।

प्रकृति केन्द्रित विकास पर द्वितीय सत्र में अवार्ड संस्था के महासचिव श्री सुरेन्द्र कुमार ने कहा आज हमारा जो विकास है, वह प्रकृति के संतुलन को बिगाड़ रहा है। इस अप्राकृतिक असंतुलन के कारण जीवन भी असंतुलित हो रहा है। हमारे विकास की पहली शर्त यह होनी चाहिये कि हम प्रकृति के साथ जिन्दा रहना सीखें। दैनिक भास्कर नागपुर के सम्पादक श्री प्रकाश दुबे ने गोविन्द जी के प्रकृति के प्रति अगाध आदर के विषय में बताया। व्यक्ति और व्यक्ति का प्रकृति प्रेम







A Tribute to the Dancing Legend Balasaraswati

Bharatnatyam, which evolved from the temple dance tradition, emerged as the dance par excellence of South India with a codified format, passing through turbulent initial years of its acceptance in the society. The art of Bharatanatyam gained a unique status and far reaching reputation, with Late Balasaraswati as a major and important torch-bearer of the illustrious Natya Sampradaya. Tanjore Balasaraswati was instrumental in popularising this classical style of dancing from Tamil Nadu not only in India but also world-wide.

The legendary Bharatanatyam artist was born on May 13th, 1918 in a treasure house of Carnatic music and dance. Balasaraswati was put under the tutelage of Guru Kandappa Pillai and he conducted Bala's recitals for several years. After years of rigorous training, Bala had her first public performance at the age of seven. Balasaraswati became a national celebrity in her early teens with an incredible repertoire.

In an illustrious career spanning several decades, she has been honoured with several prestigious awards including Padma Bhushan, Padma Vibhushan and Sangeetha Kalasikha Mani Award by the Indian Fine Arts Society of Chennai.

Coinciding with the conclusion of her centenary celebrations, IGNCA, under its *Sanskriti Samvaad Shrinkhala* series organised a two day celebration on May 13th & 14th 2019.

The programme included a panel discussion, film screening, lecture-cum-demonstration, dance homage, with the opportunity for the audience to interact with the gurus & exponents from the field of dance.

The programme commenced with a panel discussion on the legend's art, life and style of dancing by experts in the field like Dr. Sonal Mansingh, Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam, Dr. Saroja Vaidyanathan, Pt. Birju Maharaj and Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi, MS, IGNCA. The session was chaired by Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, President, IGNCA.

Expressing her admiration for the artist, Dr. Sonal Mansingh said how '...she was beyond the beautiful' and one of the top three artistes in those days. Dr. Saroja Vaidyanathan shared her childhood memories of Bala & how she had inspired her to become a Bharatanatyam danseuse, especially at a time when dance as a profession was not encouraged by families. Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam

also shared her views on Balasaraswati, as a 'great danseuse, a great actress and a musician. She was a giant tree'.

Pandit Birju Maharaj recalled anecdotes still fresh in his memory following which a Bharatnatyam homage was paid to Balasaraswati by the legend's disciple Nandini Ramani and her team which included Sushama Ranganathan, Roja V., Lavanya Ananth and Divyasena Haribabu.

The second day of the celebrations included screening of a film 'Bala', directed by Satyajit Ray followed by a lecture- demo on the dancing style of

Balasaraswati, titled 'The dance legacy of Bala', by her disciple Nandini Ramani. The celebrations concluded with a talk on Bala's contributions in the field of music titled 'Bala- The consummate musician', by eminent musician Charumati Ramachandran.

The Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts was

set up with the objective of preserving and promoting the rich cultural legacy of India. The centenary celebration of the Bharatnatyam legend, T. Balasaraswati was one such occasion, where the exponents of different classical dance forms of India came together to pay homage to this great artist who redefined 'Bharatnatyam' dance.

आईजीएनसीए द्वारा 17 जून 2019 'कबीर जयंती' के प्रसंग में निर्गुण भिक्तधारा की ज्ञानमार्गीय शाखा के प्रमुख सन्त किव महाकिव कबीर के वैचारिक दर्शन पर विमर्श सिंहत वरिष्ठ साहित्यकार एवं पूर्व प्राचार्य उच्च शिक्षा विभाग म.प्र. शासन डॉ. प्रकाश उपाध्याय की अध्यक्षता में व्याख्यान का आयोजन किया गया।

डॉ. उपाध्याय ने कबीर की विविध उक्तियों को उद्धृत करते हुए उनके दर्शन में मानवीय मूल्यों की विस्तृत विवेचना की। डॉ. उपाध्याय ने कहा कि कबीर की कविता वस्तुत: ऑखों देखी सच्चाई है, पोथियों के पन्नों में लिखी हुई बात नहीं। वे मूल्य जो मनुष्यता की परिभाषा तय करते हैं, वे कबीर के दर्शन में व्यावहारिक रूप में उपलब्ध होते हैं। कबीर की सबसे बड़ी ख़ासियत यह है कि उन्होंने जिन-जिन मूल्यों और उसूलों की बात की उन्हें सर्वप्रथम स्वयं के आचरणों में उतारा,

यही कारण है कि उनकी कथनी और करनी में कोई फर्क नहीं दिखाई देता। कबीर कालजयी किव हैं, वे कल भी प्रासंगिक थे, आज भी हैं और आने वाले समय में भी प्रासंगिक रहेंगे।

उन्होंने कबीर को शील, सादगी और साधुता की त्रिवेणी निरूपित किया। कबीर का स्वर मानवता का प्रतिनिधि स्वर है। वे मानवीय मूल्यों के प्रखर प्रवक्ता हैं। उन्होंने अपना संपूर्ण जीवन मानवीय मूल्यों के संस्थापनार्थ समर्पित कर दिया।

सदस्य सचिव डॉ. जोशी ने कार्यक्रम में मौजूद पत्रकारों से अपने भीतर के कबीर को जगाने की अपील की। उन्होंने कहा कि कबीर की उलट बांसियां कल, आज और कल हर दौर में मौजूद हैं और रास्ता दिखाती हैं। कार्यक्रम में विभागाध्यक्ष, जनपद सम्पदा प्रो. मौली कौशल, वरिष्ठ पत्रकार श्री उमेश उपाध्याय तथा अन्य पत्रकार एवं श्रोता उपस्थित रहे।

अरायश - ग्रेट ट्रेडिशन ऑफ जयपुर फ्रेस्को पेंटिंग

संरक्षण विभाग द्वारा 20-26 मई, 2019 को 'अरायश- ग्रेट ट्रेडिशन ऑफ जयपुर फ्रेस्को पेंटिंग' विषय पर एक सप्तिवसीय कार्यशाला का आयोजन किया गया, जिसमें 'अरायश' तकनीक पर व्याख्यान एवं व्यावहारिक प्रशिक्षण की व्यवस्था की गयी। इस कार्यक्रम में कुल 27 प्रितिभागियों ने भाग लिया, जिनमें स्वतंत्र संरक्षक, दृश्य-कला विद्वान, आईजीएनसीए के 'प्रिवेनटिव कन्जरवेशन' स्नातकोत्तर डिप्लोमा के छात्र तथा संरक्षण विभाग के प्रशिक्षु शामिल थे। प्रो. भवानी शंकर शर्मा ने इस कार्यशाला का संचालन किया। प्रो. शर्मा ने 'अरायश' तकनीक के संरक्षण और पुनरुद्धार में महत्त्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई है और इस कला को दिल्ली, आगरा, चंडीगढ़, चेन्नई, जयपुर, बड़ौदा तथा कनाडा सिंहत विभिन्न स्थानों पर लोकप्रिय बनाने के लिए कई कार्यशालाओं का आयोजन किया है।

फ्रोस्को और अन्य भित्ति-चित्रण तकनीक हमारे देश में भारतीय कला तथा ज्ञान के अधिग्रहण के साथ-साथ धार्मिक भावना के विकास में संवर्धन के लिए एक विशिष्ट साधक रही है। अजन्ता, बाग और कोचीन की भित्ति-चित्रण इसी कला के आकर्षक उदाहरण हैं। राजस्थान राज्य नि:सन्देह अत्यन्त गर्व से इस प्राचीन कला को जीवित रूप में संरक्षित करने और इसके प्रचार के कई प्रमाण प्रस्तुत करता है, यह तकनीक आमेर, जयपुर, शेखावत, अलवर, उदयपुर, जोधपुर, बीकानेर, नागौर, कोटा, बूंदी, उनियारा और अन्य स्थानों में सबसे अधिक प्रचलित थी। प्राचीन घरों, मन्दिरों, किलों, महलों आदि में ड्राइंग, सजाने के लिए इसका बड़े पैमाने पर उपयोग किया गया है। जयपुर की भित्ति-चित्रों में "गीली प्रक्रिया" फ्रेस्को तकनीक विभिन्न नामों से प्रसिद्ध है - 'अरायश', 'अलगिला' या 'मोरकशी'। 'अरायश' संगमरमर कारीगरी का एक सहज पूरक है। 'अरायश' से बनी दीवारें संगमरमर की तरह चिकनी और दर्पण की तरह चमकदार होती हैं। इस तकनीक में स्थायित्व के अलावा अन्य महत्वपूर्ण बात यह है कि इससे बने फर्श और दीवारें वातानुकूलित रहती हैं। पानी को साफ और ठंडा रखने के लिए इन तकनीकों का उपयोग करके विशाल पानी के टैंक तैयार किये जाते थे। पश्चिमी दुनिया में इसी प्रकार की तकनीक को फ्रेस्को के रूप में जाना जाता है तथा आमतौर पर यह हमेशा ताजा तैयार दीवारों की सतहों पर प्रयुक्त होती है। ईसाई मिशनरियों ने अकबर और जहाँगीर के शासनकाल में इतालवी फ्रोस्को तकनीक का उपयोग करना शुरू किया था। आमेर तथा जयपुर शासकों के घरों में मुगलों के साथ घनिष्ठता के कारण, यह तकनीक इन क्षेत्रों में बहुत विकसित हुई। इन जयपुरी और इतालवी तकनीक के बीच अंतर यह है कि दीवार को

जयपुर तकनीक में पॉलिश किया गया है जबिक इतालवी प्रक्रिया में इसे मोटा छोड़ दिया गया। फलस्वरूप जयपुर तकनीक में एक अलग तरह का आकर्षण एवं स्थायित्व है। वस्तुत: प्रसार तथा प्रोत्साहन की कमी, सीमेंट-प्लास्टर और सस्ती विविधताओं की बढ़ती लोकप्रियता और फ्रेस्को के कुशल कारीगर की कमी से इसका उपयोग पिछले कई वर्षों से कम हो गया है।



आईजीएनसीए, क्षेत्रीय केन्द्र, वाराणसी एवं पार्श्वनाथ विद्यापीठ, वाराणसी के संयुक्त तत्त्वावधान में शास्त्र अध्ययन, सम्पादन एवं सम्पादन प्रविधि पर आधारित 'उच्चस्तरीय पाण्डुलिपिविज्ञान' कार्यशाला का आयोजन 03 जून से 02 जुलाई 2019 तक किया गया, जिसका उद्घाटन श्री जगन्नाथ संस्कृत विश्वविद्यालय के धर्मशास्त्र विभाग के पूर्वाध्यक्ष प्रो. ब्रजिकशोर स्वाई की अध्यक्षता में हुआ। सम्पूर्णानन्द संस्कृत विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपित प्रो. राजाराम शुक्ल मुख्य अतिथि तथा म०गाँ०क०विद्यापीठ के मानविकी संकाय के संकाय प्रमुख एवं संस्कृत विभागाध्यक्ष प्रो. उमारानी त्रिपाठी सारस्वत अतिथि के रूप में उपस्थित रहे। कार्यशाला में देशभर के विभिन्न विश्वविद्यालयों एवं परिसरों के कुल 25 प्रतिभागियों ने भाग लिया।



Art Exhibition: Kalamkari and Panchtantra

Puducherry Regional Centre in association with Shri Aurobindo Ashram, Puducherry organised Kalamkari and Panchatantra Art Exhibition. Shri Ganesan the Director of Art and Culture, Govt. of Puducherry gave presidential address. In his inagural address he mentioned that Puducherry is fortunate to see 3000 years old Kalamkari painting techniques and conveyed his heartfelt gratitude to IGNCA for showcasing its rare collections. Kalamkari is the ancient Indian art of organic fabric painting and it is a historical and effective art form that originated about 3000 years ago. Kalamkari art make use of special pens which are particularly crafted for this purpose from the bamboo tree. This is a type of hand painted or block printed cotton textile produced in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. This style developed around temples by their patronage and so had an almost religious identity scrolls, temple hangings, temple car, depicted deities and scenes taken from the great Epics Ramayana, Mahabharata as well as Mythological Classics.

Likewise, the Panchatantra (Five Treatises) is an ancient Indian collection of interrelated animal fables in Sanskrit, arranged within a frame story. The surviving work is dated to roughly 200 BCE, based on older oral traditions.

Dr. Prabhakaran, former Principal, Bharathiar Palkalaikoodam, a centre for Performing and Fine Arts and Shri Kaliya Perumal, Superintendent, Art and Culture discussed about the art of Kalamkari and Panchatantra.

Anthropology and Tribes of India: Livelihood Perspectives

A lecture titled 'Anthropology and Tribes of India: Livelihood Perspectives' was organized by IGNCA, RCR in collaboration with Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Ranchi on 30th May 2019 at Ramkrishna Mission Ashrama auditorium.

The lecture was delivered by Dr. Dipankar Chatterjee, HoD of Integrated Rural and Tribal Development Management (IRTDM), Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute (Deemed University). The lecture was chaired by Pujya Swami Bhaveshananda, Secretary, Rama-krishna Mission Ashrama, Ranchi Branch. The main objective behind organizing lecture was to evoke people's concern towards the sustainable livelihood approach practiced by various tribes spread across the geographical terrains of India.

A lot of ethnographic discourse mostly conceptual and empirical accounts indicate that tribal communities establish a direct and intimate relationship with the physical environ-ment around them mostly because of their near-total dependence on the physical environment for their livelihood. The lecture primarily focused on the culturally embedded sustainable practices of livelihood generation and bio diversity conservation among the tribes.

Dr. Chatterjee gave the demographic details of the tribal population both in India and outside Indian Territory. Further, he also covered the aspects related to the classification of tribes on the basis of linguistic, spatial, temporal, regional, racial and economic background.

He also unfolded the paradigms of livelihoods approach; how and what makes it sustainable? One of the important aspects of sustainable livelihood approach is that it recognises the importance of the ability to access resources and entitlements,

reduces risk and vulnerability, and oral testimonies. It also looks at how people utilize these assets and negotiate their problems.

The method of analysing livelihood system of the tribal communities in terms of optimum utilisation of assets/opportunities rather than encountering problem was also mentioned.

Through his own ethnographic accounts and fieldwork experiences, he enlightened the audience with case studies on specific tribes of the region namely Gond, Bhil, Santhal, Saura Paharia, Toto, Siddi, Naga, Andamanese, Irula, Chenchu, Garo and Jarwa, etc.

Bookaroo: Festival of Children's Literature

IGNCA, NERC and Bookaroo trust jointly organized the 'Festival of Children's Literature', including storytelling, drama, workshops and art & craft from 28th-29th June 2019 at Taktse International School, Gangtok, Sikkim. Bookaroo's first Gangtok edition in collaboration with IGNCA's North East Regional Centre, Guwahati Assam generated great excitement amongst the children. Day one was a Schools' day while day 2 was open to families.

For a first-time event, it was a heart-warming response. Fifteen schools from around Gangtok sent their children (of various age groups) to attend 29 sessions from 9:30 am to 3:00 pm on day 1. It was a huge success as the children and their teachers rushed from venue to venue to soak in the stories and tales. The school was transformed into a typical Bookaroo venue. Various areas of the school had Bookaroo sub-venue names such as The Theatre, The Turret, Doodle Wall, Kahani Tree, Crafty Corner

and the Studio. There were two ongoing sessions running right through the day to make sure that even the breaks had something for everyone. From making masks to mapping Gangtok to knowing about wild India to shadow puppetry to listening to tales from the region, Bookaroo Gangtok had a complete package for a child to choose their area of interest. Authors, illustrators & speakers on Children's literature from various places in India, one each from Nepal & Bhutan regaled children with stories, interesting facts, poetry, music & arts. Nearly seven hundred fifty children & their parents attended the festival over the two days. Books by participating authors were put up for sale & were also signed by the respective authors for the children.


Bookaroo's festival directors, Ms. Swati Roy and Shri M Venkatesh believed that this year's experiment has been quite heart-warming considering that such a festival was an unknown factor for the children and parents in Gangtok. 'The fact that fifteen schools made it a point to send their children to the festival made it worth the effort', they said. All of this became possible because of the support of IGNCA NERC Guwahati, Taktse International School and the publishers. The speakers were amazed at the response they received from the children as their creativity came to the fore in every interactive session that was held.

Lecture on Hajo: a symbol of Socio-Cultural Integration

NERC, IGNCA organized a talk entitled, 'Hajo: a symbol of Socio-Cultural Integration', under its

monthly program series. Hajo is an ancient pilgrimage centre for Hindus, Buddhists, and Muslims. The term 'Hajo' is derived from Bodo dialect where 'Ha' means 'high' and 'Jo' means 'land', thereby implying it as 'highland'. The place is known for its' ancient temples as well as other monuments, housings sacred artifacts.

Hajo is also known as Panchatirtha, where one temple is devoted to Lord Vishnu, one to Lord Ganesha and three to Lord Shiva named as Kedar. Kameswar and Kamaleswar temples. The Hayagriva Madhava temple, which is one of the most significant and important temples in Hajo is devoted to Lord Vishnu, who is worshipped here in his Narashima Avtara. The temple is visited and worshipped both by Hindu and Buddhist devotees. According to one popular belief among the Buddhist devotees, it is believed that the Lord Buddha attained his mahaparinirvana in this place. The Ganesha temple at Hajo was constructed during the reign of the Ahom King Pramatta Singha between 1744-1751. Hajo is also famous for powa mecca, a holy pilgrimage of the Muslims. The term powa mecca means a quarter of land from Mecca which is a holy Islamic shrine. The mosque or the powa mecca which was initially built by Suja, a Mughul prince (Aurangzab's brother); was renovated during the rule of another Ahom king Swargadeo Rudra Singha, also known as an architect of ancient Assam between 1696-1714.

'SAMPARK' Summer Camp 2019

IGNCA's Vadodara Regional Centre organised an exhibition of artworks created by children during the five-day 'SAMPARK' Summer Camp 2019 was held from 22nd to 27th April in collaboration with the Baroda Museum and Picture Gallery.

It included five-seven works each by all of the 25 participants, created during the camp around its five major activities. The exhibition was inaugurated on 3rd May and was on display for public viewing till 8th May during the museum hours.

Three Museum Walks:

The activities during the month of May included three museum walks as part of International Museum Day (IMD) celebration. The first one - 'Buddhist Art: Symbolism and Mythology' was led by Mr. Sudip Das, Asst. Professor, Department of Art History and Aesthetics, Faculty of Fine Arts, Maharaja Sayajirao University, Baroda. It was held on 4th May at the Baroda Museum and Picture Gallery, Vadodara.

The museum walk explored mythological stories and symbolism related to Buddhist art and philosophy. The walk was attended by eight to ten people which included students from the Art History Dept., members from the museum staff and a few other general visitors.

The second museum walk 'Family Fun at Maharaja Fateh Singh Museum' was organised by IGNCA VRC, on 18th May in collaboration with Maharaja Fateh Singh Museum, Vadodara. This was a family programme specially planned to commemorate IMD celebrations. The programme included a guided walk-through the museum that revolved around stories and facts of the various

Gaekwad rulers, the erstwhile rulers of Baroda and mythological stories around Raja Ravi Varma's paintings. The underpinning objective of the programme was to promote the idea of 'colearning', to tap families as a resource for children's learning and to explore the notion of 'museum learning' amongst the people of Baroda.

Thirty six people attended the programme which included seventeen children (aged 8-15 years) with one parent each, and two local tourist guides from the Vadodara Municipal Corporation (VMC).

The event was covered in the local newspapers on the following day. Since it was museum day celebration, entry fees to all the participants of the family programme were waived off by the museum. The children were also provided light refreshment at the end of the session.

In this continuity of IMD celebrations, the third 'Museum Walk and Storytelling Session for Young Children' was conducted on 19th May for a group of under-privileged children at the Baroda Museum and Picture Gallery, Vadodara, in collaboration with the Youth Humanity Foundation, a Baroda based NGO. In all, thirty two people attended the walk which included twenty six children and six volunteers.

The objective of the walk was to introduce them to the concept of a museum, familiarise them to their local history and heritage, and foster a positive learning experience in a museum.

This session concluded with a hands-on activity in which children solved an activity sheet, specially prepared in Hindi to cater to their linguistic needs and comprehension level. The authorities of the Baroda Museum extended their generous support by making the session 'free' for all the participants.

Book Circle


